What is Freedom?

To Satan, freedom is doing what you want. How many wars have been fought for freedom? How many people in the past have died for freedom? With all the wars that have been fought for freedom, does the world enjoy peace? What does God's word say about freedom and wars?

James 4:1-4 talks about this; 'What is the source of quarrels and conflicts among you? Is not the source your pleasures [*your self-interest*] that wages war inside your body? You lust [*covet*] and do not have; so you commit murder. You are envious and cannot obtain [*have your own way*] so you fight and quarrel. Even when you pray to God for things, you ask with wrong motives, so that you may spend it on your own pleasures [*because you want what you want for self*]. You adulteresses, do you not know that friendship with the world is hostility toward God? [*When you continue to live selfish, inward lives, you are continuing to live like the world lives*]. Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend to the world makes himself an enemy of God.' [*This, then, is the same as committing adultery against God.*]

Nations fight and kill each other for the same reasons—sin and human nature. **Jesus was sent to this world to show man how to escape from this human nature, which has kept him enslaved by the devil. Man is being held captive by Satan to do his will** (2 Tim. 2:26). Jesus said to seek the truth and you will be set free from your present nature which is evil, compared to God's nature which is righteous and pure.

Seek the truth [God's word] and it will set you free from all religious error which grips the world. **Seek the truth and it will set you free from Satan who has deceived the whole world** (John 8:32; Rev. 12:9).

By daily study of God's word by subject, you not only can prove that God exists but also

that He rewards those who diligently seek Him (Heb. 11:6). You will find God's word to be a true history of man and that the world is full of pagan, godless lies, which are being taught to your children in schools and colleges.

For example, your children are being taught that writing, and the writing of books, did not occur until a recent date and as a result, books were not available to people long ago. However, in Halley's Bible Handbook, an article is written on page 5 called: "Libraries in Abraham's Day and Schools in Abraham's Day." 'Jesus also said that those who would be followers of His would do more deeds of kindness than He did.'





Halley's Bible Handbook also describes how Jesus Christ lived and gave us example to live. On page 20, it says: "As a man, He lived the most beautiful life ever known. He was the kindest, gentlest, most tender, most patient, most sympathetic man. He loved people. He hated to see people in trouble. He loved to forgive. He loved to help. He fed hungry people. It is said of Him, in John 21:25, that if all the deeds of kindness He did were written, the world could not contain the books." Jesus also said that those who would be followers of His would do more deeds of kindness than He did (John 14:12).

It is this precious Way of life that Jesus came to show mankind, which is called the Way of righteousness. This is true freedom. It is also the directions to eternal life (John 12:47-50; Matt. 21:32).

How to Study



Many people simply read the Bible and think that is considered studying God's word. But when you study the Bible, you should look for answers to questions. What does the Bible say about dancing, drinking, salvation or overcoming? What is God's Will? How do you clothe yourself with Jesus Christ, abide in Jesus Christ or walk like Jesus Christ? How do you keep His works? How do you pray? How do you repent? How do you overcome? How do you live to please God?

Word I Have Hid in My Heart

“Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against Thee” (Psalm 119:11 *King James Version*). This is some very precious wisdom from God’s word. Before we can hide His word in our hearts, we need to know what His word says. In order to know it, we need to study and search the Scriptures (2 Tim. 2:15 *King James Version*). **We need to find out what the Lord is trying to show us in His word from the beginning to the end.**

Let’s look at the beginning in Genesis 4:7 where the Lord told Cain, “If you do well [do good], will not your countenance be lifted up [you will feel good about yourself]? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it.” Yes, just as the Lord told Cain, He is telling us. **We must master sin. We do this by doing what it says in Romans 12:21:** “Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.”

Looking at the life of Abraham, one of our forefathers, we see a man of God practicing acts of righteousness [good deeds]. He was pleasing to the Lord by being upright in all his ways. He practiced justice and honesty towards his fellow man (Gen. 18:19). **Some good examples of justice and honesty for us to follow are: Keep our word; be on time; pay our bills; do no harm to our neighbors but do only good to them.** Abraham obeyed God and lived by faith (Heb. 11:8). Without faith, it is impossible to please God, and without works—yes, good deeds for God—faith cannot exist (Heb. 11:6; James 2:26). Read James 2:14-24 to see how Abraham was justified and righteous in God’s sight.

Another man of God in the Old Testament was Job. In Job 29:12-17, it tells how Job lived and imitated the Lord. **He helped the poor, the orphans, the widows, the blind, the lame and the needy.** Job put on righteousness. Yes, he practiced doing good to anyone who crossed his

path who needed help or cheering up. Job’s righteousness clothed him, which means it was part of him every day in all he thought, said and did.


As we continue to search the Scriptures, we find in the New Testament a tremendous man of God who taught and preached righteousness—the same Way of life taught to Cain, Abel, Abraham, Job and many others. This man was the Apostle Paul, who traveled about teaching others how to live to please God daily. He was a direct representative of Jesus Christ - the Son of God - who came to show us, and confirm for us, that **we should live by every word that comes out of the mouth of God** (Deut. 8:3; Matt. 4:4).

During His life, Jesus taught the Way of righteousness, justice and love that men of God in the Old Testament lived and as a result, they were very blessed by God. Jeremiah 6:16 says to stand by the Ways of the Lord and see and ask for the “ancient paths” where the good Way is and walk in it. You will find rest for your souls. Then, see Matthew 11:28-30, “Come to Me all who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me and you shall find rest for your souls.” God is the same yesterday, today and forever (Heb. 13:8). **Jesus Christ was the supreme sacrifice for all mankind.** He made it possible for us to live this righteous Way of life and receive His Spirit. If we are obedient to His word by practicing His Ways, then His blood covers our sins (1 Peter 1:2; 1 John 1:7).

Let’s live by every word that comes out of the mouth of God and hide His precious word in our heart as King David did so that we might not sin against God (Psalm 119:11 KJV).

Start Your Day in a Spiritual Way

The word of God says if we walk in the Spirit, we will not carry out the evil desires of the flesh (Gal. 5:16). That means, **if we live only to please God, every day, we won't carry out the evil desires of the flesh.** If we walk in the Spirit, then we will live as Jesus lived, imitating God daily (Eph. 5:1; 2 Cor. 3:17).

Set aside at least 15 minutes to do a Bible study each morning.
