Who Will Be Partakers of Resurrection?

One solid proof that the Bible is still the greatest of all mystery books is the fact that there are so many different concepts of the resurrection. The question of who will be resurrected is a mystery to most people today.

John 5:29 says those who did good deeds will receive a resurrection of life. No wonder the apostles were confident about telling people to be careful to engage in good deeds (Titus 3:8). They taught the people that doing good is something they would have to learn to do (Titus Every man will be recompensed 3:14). according to his deeds (Matt. 16:27; Rev. 22:12). Romans 2:6-7 says that Christ will render to every man according to his deeds and those who seek eternal life must persevere in doing good. Of course, all good deeds must be done in the name of Jesus Christ, as He commanded (Col. 3:17).

Yes, each one of us will give account of himself to God (Rom. 14:12). Jesus Christ searches our hearts and our minds and He is going to reward us according to our deeds, both the bad and the good deeds (Rev. 2:23; Col. 3:25). "But who is there to harm you if you prove zealous [enthusiastic] for good deeds?" (1 Peter 3:13). No one can harm you because one who is zealous in doing good deeds is wearing the full armor of God (Eph. 6:11, 13). God's word cautions us that we will reap what we sow, for it is impossible to mock or fool God (Gal. 6:7).

We are not to get weary in doing good deeds because this is how we overcome our evil natures (Gal. 6:8-10; 2 Thess. 3:13; Rom. 12:21).

Who Will Be Partakers of Resurrection?

It is also how we live to the Spirit and put to death the deeds of the flesh (Gal. 5:24-25; Rom. 8:13).

Those who live in this way, being zealous for good deeds and overcoming their evil natures to the end, will come up in the first resurrection.

Those who live in this way, being zealous for good deeds and overcoming their evil natures to the end, will come up in the first resurrection. The word of God calls those who are partakers in the first resurrection the first fruits, or the firstborn (James 1:18; Heb. 12:23). The second fruits are the rest of the dead who will not come alive until after the 1,000 year reign of Christ (Rev. 20:5, 12-13).

Right now, judgment has come upon the household of God (1 Peter 4:17-19). Judgment means a space of time in which a person is allowed to overcome his or her nature. He does this by keeping Christ's deeds or works daily, overcoming the world and the pulls of the flesh and living like Jesus lived (Rev. 2:26; Luke 8:21; John 14:12, 15; Col. 3:5; 1 John 2:6).

Remember, the majority of the people who have lived in the past have not heard the complete message of Jesus Christ (Matt. 7:13-14). Most people have not been called of Jesus Christ in this age. Thanks to God, everyone who ever lived will eventually have a chance to be born of God by practicing righteousness (2 Peter 3:9). They will be partakers in the second resurrection (John 8:51). At that time, those who have not known the truth or been called, will have the opportunity to overcome their evil natures, just as we who are called now must live our lives daily to please the One who called us to righteousness.

If we have not yet started to please God in all our ways, right now is a perfect time to begin!

Either way, each person will have an opportunity for salvation. Each person will also be judged according to his or her deeds, whether good or evil (Jer. 17:10). If we have been called now and our deeds are pleasing to God, we will partake in the first resurrection and receive eternal life (1 Cor. 15:23-24; 1 Thess. 4:16-17). If we have not yet started to please God in all our ways, right now is a perfect time to begin!



When is the First Resurrection?

With the use of deductive reasoning and the wisdom that God gives us, we can determine when the first resurrection will take place, that is, in what time frame.

No rain will fall from the sky for the last three and one-half years before the first resurrection.

No rain will fall from the sky for the last three and one-half years before the first resurrection (Rev. 11:6). Then, just before the first resurrection takes place, people around the world will rejoice over the death of God's two anointed ones because they preached to the people to repent and repent from taking the mark of the beast (Rev. 11:10; 14:9-11). It will be like the days of Noah, when the wickedness of man was great and every intent of the thoughts of his heart was continually evil (Matt. 24:37; Gen. 6:5). People will praise the beast for murdering God's true prophets, for God will send upon them a deluding influence so that they believe what is false (2 Thess. 2:10-12). They will have had their chance to know the truth, but they refused to believe it when they heard it preached by the two witnesses of God. Matthew 24:22 says that those days must be cut short for the sake of the elect or no life would be saved on this earth.

The first resurrection will take place at the last trumpet. The dead will rise first.

The first resurrection then, will take place at the last trumpet. Jesus Christ is the first fruits—the first one resurrected to eternal life. Then, all dead disciples of Jesus Christ that are asleep, and waiting for His coming at the end of this age, will then be resurrected to reign with Him (1 Thess. 4:16-17; 1 Cor. 15:18, 20, 23-24, 51). That is when all bond-servants of Jesus Christ will receive eternal life (Heb. 11:39-40). The Lord is going to perform wonders for the dead. The departed spirits will rise to praise God (Psalm 88:10).

Then, and only then, we who are alive and remain will be changed in the twinkling of an eye (1 Cor. 15:51-52). Again, this will take place after the two witnesses have finished giving their testimony, just before the third woe, as the seventh angel sounds the last trump (1 Thess. 4:15-17; Rev. 11:3, 7-12, 14-17). This will be at the end of the beast's three and one-half year reign.

We also know that after the first resurrection, the marriage supper of the Lamb will take place on a mountain and those who are His bond-servants will be invited.

The Bible says this wedding feast will take place directly east of Jerusalem. It will most likely be at Mount Nebo in Jordan, because Christ will be coming from the east and will go west to Jerusalem (Matt. 24:27).

Are you ready for these things to take place?

We know that when Christ comes to fight the armies of the earth, which will be gathered to fight Him at His return, His disciples will be following Him on white horses (Rev. 16:14; 19:11-16, 19). Then the 1,000 year rest will begin (Rev. 20:4). This will be a time when Christ must reign so He can put all of His enemies under His feet (1 Cor. 15:25). He will teach all nations concerning His Ways (Is. 2:3; Micah 4:2-3). This will be a time when the Lord will be King over all the earth and if any nation refuses to go up to Jerusalem to be taught by Christ, God will withhold rain from that nation (Zech. 14:9, 17; Psalm 102:15; 100:1; 99:1; 97:1; 93:1). Are you ready for these things to take place?□

The Second Resurrection



The first resurrection is mentioned many times throughout Scripture. It is a resurrection of the righteous (Luke 14:14). But not everyone was being called in Christ's day, or for that matter, in the Old Testament. The Bible says a partial hardening happened with the Jews and it will continue until the time of the Gentiles is fulfilled (2 Cor. 3:14-15). This hardening is prophesied to end at the return of Jesus Christ to this earth (Zech. 12:10; Rev. 1:7). What is to become of all the Jewish people and many other people who did not have a chance for salvation?

Elijah thought that he was the only one who knew the truth of God, but God said that He was working with 7,000 others at that same time (1 Kings 19:18; Rom. 11:3-4). Jesus said that if the miracles He did in other cities had been done in Sodom and Gomorrah, they would have repented (Matt. 11:23). But God did not allow them to repent, did He?

God Himself is picking and choosing, calling and teaching those who were predestined to be called in this era. You can pray and ask God to call someone now. Some people may seek God with their whole heart and He will not turn away from them (Prov. 8:17; 2 Cor. 3:16). But the majority of people are not being called at this time, nor were they in Christ's day or any other era.

Those being called now will teach the people in the future and will help Jesus Christ reign

and put His enemies under His heel.

God is just calling those now who will be priests and kings and teachers (Rev. 2:26). Those being called now will teach the people in the future and will help Jesus Christ reign and put His enemies under His heel (1 Cor. 15:25). That's what we will be doing during the first 1,000 years following the first resurrection (Rev. 20:4).

The rest of the dead will not come to life until after the 1,000 years are completed!

The rest of the dead will not come to life until after the 1,000 years are completed (Rev. 20:5)! Who are the rest of the dead? They are all those people from the time of Adam to the time of the return of Christ who did not have a chance for salvation. Their eyes and ears were closed. In mercy, they were closed, for God does not wish any to perish but that all men be saved (Rom. 11:32; 2 Peter 3:9).

Those resurrected at this time will be given their chance for salvation.

Ezekiel 37:1-10 describes that great second resurrection in vivid detail. Notice in Ezekiel 37:5-6 that the dead bones are given skin and breath is put into them. This is not a spiritual resurrection, where those who are resurrected are given spiritual bodies, but rather it is a physical resurrection to a physical life of 100 years, instead of 70 years as we have been given today (Is. 65:20; Psalm 90:10). Those resurrected at this time will be given their chance Isaiah 65:20-25 speaks of the for salvation. reign of Christ, when a lion will eat straw like an ox. It is speaking of the end of the millennium. It is speaking of the second resurrection. Isn't it a blessing to clearly see God's plan for the future?

Let God teach you by studying His word daily (1 John 2:27; John 6:45; 2 Tim. 2:7). Stop reading other books and pamphlets written about the Bible, which continually keep many in a state of religious confusion (Eccl. 12:12; 1 Cor. 4:6). Now is the time to stop worshiping men who preach religious concepts and ideas of men and worship the Lord in vain by doing so (Matt. 15:9; Mark 7:7).

Now is the time to not look up to Christ, but imitate Him, live like Him and talk like Him.

Now is the time to imitate Christ, live like Him and talk like Him. If He had wanted us to simply look up to Him instead of imitate Him, He would have come in the majestic form of a king or ruler; but He came as a humble servant to show us the attitude we must have toward others if we are to be pleasing to Him (1 Peter 4:11; Matt. 20:28; Phil. 2:6-8).

Now is the time to change, to repent and to live the rest of your days to be pleasing to the Lord on a personal, one-to-one, day-to-day basis.

Now is the time for many to stop playing church and start being holy by living holy, for without holiness, no one will see the Lord (Heb. 12:14, King James Version). Now is the time to discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness and start building godly character on your tree, which is typified in God's word as good fruit (Col. 1:10; Matt. 3:10; 7:19; 1 Tim. 4:7). Now is the time to look up these Scriptures in God's word and prove that what you are reading is true. Now is the time to change, to repent and to live the rest of your days to be pleasing to the Lord on a personal, one-to-one, day-to-day basis.

Treasures in Heaven

What did Jesus Christ mean when He said in Matthew 6:20-21, "But lay up for yourself treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in and steal; for where your treasure is, there will be your heart also." What was He saying in this parable—this riddle or dark mysterious statement (Psalm 78:2; Matt. 13:35; Mark 4:33-34)?

The answer is found by knowing what the Will of God is. Notice what is revealed when we compare other Scriptures, and how this unlocks the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Luke 12:16-21 is a parable about a rich man whose only concern was himself and his own well-being. Because this individual was living to please only himself and not God in heaven, he was unaware that there was a God in heaven who could call for his life to end at any time. The man should have been rich towards God by storing up treasures in heaven. Then, God would not have called for his life to end so abruptly.

One more Scripture, and we will have the mysterious parable of Matthew 6:20-21 revealed. This Scripture is 1 Timothy 6:17-18. It says to

instruct those who are rich (well-off materially) in this present world not to be conceited (think they are better than others and thus, look down on the needy) or to fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God instead, who is the one who supplies us with all these things to enjoy. Now, here is the key! Instruct them to do good with their money, with their possessions and with their time, for this is how to be rich in good works done for the glory of God, as Jesus gave example to do (Matt. 5:16). Being generous, then, is how we glorify God in our daily lives.

Be sure to do all that you do in good works or good words—like cheering up people—in the name of Jesus Christ for the glory of the Father (Col. 3:17). Those works, then, will be written in the book of life, and you will be judged by them (Rev. 20:12). The good works are for your repentance, for your blessings and for your spiritual growth (Acts 26:20; 3:26). If you do good works from a pure heart for repentance and endure to the end doing so, you can rest assured that you will be considered worthy to attain to the age of the resurrection from the dead (Luke 20:35; 21:19; John 5:29). This is the treasure of treasures!
