It guarantees you obedient children who do not go astray when they are older (Prov. 22:6) when you follow the royal advice of Proverbs 29:15 and 17. premium by living Christ's Way of life. Jesus Christ qualified you to be a policyholder regardless of your present condition, but you must not stay in your present condition. You must die to self and deny your old way of life daily (1 Cor. 15:31; Luke 9:23). Instead, you must live Christ's new Way of life (Heb. 10:20; Matt. 21:32). This is done by practicing righteousness, good deeds and good works to please and glorify the Father (1 John 2:29; Gal. 6:9; John 10:25, 32, 37-38; 14:12; Matt. 5:16). You must do all that you do and say in Christ's name as a happy slave of Christ (Col. 3:17; Eph. 6:6; Rom. 6:18-19).

'You must strive until God creates in you a new nature...'

Overcome your nature by doing good, being zealous, persevering in good works and

keeping Christ's deeds, which are all righteous—God's righteousness (1 Peter 3:13; Rom. 12:21; 2:7; 10:3; Luke 21:19; Rev. 2:26; Prov. 19:17). You must strive until God creates in you a new nature, establishes you, and puts your nature under your heel (Luke 13:24; Prov. 22:9; 1 Peter 5:10; Heb. 10:36; Rom. 16:20).

Jesus Christ's Way is easy and pleasant (Matt. 11:30). Children would have no problem with it (Matt. 19:14; 18:4). But once you start, don't look back; just keep going straight forward into the good life, which is the godly life that God has been waiting for many to live (Luke 17:31; 1 Tim. 4:7; Eph. 5:1; 1 Cor. 11:1; Titus 1:1).□

God's Financial Plan



God wants to <u>bless you</u>. He wants to bless you with a better job, home, car, and all the desires of your heart that are according to His Will. The Bible is full of promises that apply to you if you obey and practice its concepts.

Matthew 6:33 says to first seek the kingdom and His righteousness, and all your wants and needs will be satisfied. Notice, the first part tells you what you must do (*keep God's Ways*) and the second part tells you what God will do (*bless you*). Proverbs 3:3-10 also explains what you should do to please God and what He will do if you do your part.

'Give and it will be given to you —good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over (Luke 6:38).'

You honor the Lord with your wealth when you are rich in good works (1 Tim. 6:18). Go out and do good with the money you set aside for honoring God. Give and it will be given to you—good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over (Luke 6:38). That's a pretty good return, isn't it? Because you are constantly

giving and showing kindness to others, God will cause people to bless you.

'God says He will open the windows of heaven and pour out blessings until you have no more room to receive them...'

Yes, God's financial plan works. Notice how God gave back to Job twice what he lost during his test (Job 42:10-12). God promises to protect your crops by telling the bugs not to harm them (Mal. 3:11). God says He will open the windows of heaven and pour out blessings until you have no more room to receive them if you give to Him by sharing a portion of your wealth (paycheck) with others (Mal. 3:10). Everyone will call you blessed (Mal. 3:12).

"...If you give bountifully, God will bless you bountifully..."

The same principle holds true for your money (2 Cor. 9:6-10). If you are a tightwad who sows sparingly, God will bless you sparingly. But if

you give bountifully, God will bless you bountifully. You must, however, give from your heart—not grudgingly, but cheerfully. God will see that you always have an abundance with which to do good. Just do as God does for the poor by giving money, love, food, clothing, furniture and all forms of righteousness (Luke 3:10-14). The whole reason for making money is to have something to share with those in need (Eph. 4:28). God always pays you back (Eph. 6:8; Heb. 6:10; 13:16; Jer. 17:10, 13; 32:19; Psalm 75:6-7; Job 34:11; Col. 3:24; Prov. 19:17; 24:12, 29; Deut. 7:9-13; Ezek. 9:10; Rev. 22:12).

'Beware of thinking it's okay to do evil as long as you do some good for God.'

If you live to please God every day by pleasing Him in all your ways, He will bless you in all your ways. You must learn to do good, think proper thoughts, and do everything in Christ's name (Col. 3:17). Beware of thinking it's okay to do evil as long as you do some good for God. Beware of not paying your bills when you have the means to do so (Ezek. 33:13-16). Charge cards, bank loans, and buy-on-credit practices are often the beginning of trouble. Owe nothing to anyone, as much as possible (Rom. 13:8). If you live by these principles you will have tremendous peace in your life (1 Tim. 6:7-8, 10-11).

'Buy only what you can afford and do not covet what others have.'

Put on the Lord Jesus Christ and <u>make no provisions for the flesh</u> in regard to its lust for cars, money, big homes or possessions. Buy only what you can afford and do not covet what

others have. Then you will not be tempted to steal by failing to pay your debts (Jer. 22:15-16; Ezek. 33:17-20).

'Do not grow weary in doing what God says.'

Jesus Christ came to show you how to have a more abundant life (John 10:10). Do not grow weary in doing what God says (Gal. 6:9; 2 Thess. 3:13). Obey these principles, and God will bless you bountifully as you live to serve others for Him.□
