

Jesus Christ is coming, and you will see proof of this by observing world events. Jesus said when you see certain things occur, you will know prophecy is being fulfilled.

At the end of this age, God's wrath will be against all nations of the earth. **His judgment will be with all peoples of the earth.** Never before, since the days of Noah, has the whole earth been judged. The Way of repentance is called the Way of righteousness (Matt. 21:32).

Jesus Christ's message and John the Baptist's message were the same as the message that must be proclaimed to the world before the Lord judges the nations. This message proclaims that the kingdom of heaven within is entered through repentance (Matt. 3:2; 4:17; Luke 17:21). It commands you to bring forth fruit—good works—showing that you are repentant before God (Col. 1:10; Acts 26:20). You repent and turn to God by performing works



for the reason of repentance. These works are not for salvation because salvation cannot be earned by any good works. But at the same time, you cannot enter the kingdom within and be converted, or overcome, unless you repent and become involved in a life of doing good for God (Titus 3:8). You serve God by serving others and you seek God by doing good (Rom. 3:11-12; Mark 9:35).

Once again, before He returns, the Lord must distinguish between the one who will serve Him and the one who will not. This is how the righteous and the wicked will be distinguished (Mal. 3:18). Deception:

Jesus said there would be a false christ and false prophets or preachers who would come in the end times with carefully devised messages, designed to mislead those who could be misled.

What is their cleverly devised message, and what makes it so deceptive? Always keep in mind that Satan is an impostor. He is a deceiver, extortioner and mimicker of the true message. Many people do not study the Bible because they say they cannot understand it. This is a lie from their satanic natures causing them to give up before they even start. The word of God calls it one of the schemes of Satan, because Satan has many tricks up his sleeve. After all, he is the author of "trick-or-treat."

There is something terribly wrong, however, with Satan and his followers. They are divided. Jesus said if Satan's kingdom is divided, it cannot stand (Matt. 12:25). Satan's kingdom is divided by competition, ego, strife, jealousy and all the deeds of the flesh mentioned in Galatians 5:19-21. His ministers compete with one another. They constantly devise traditions of men that set their congregations apart from those of their fellow humans. Jesus said there would be false christs—plural—showing that there is division in Satan's ranks (Matt. 24:24). Jesus tells us we are not to go after these religious charlatans, or we will be religiously misled (Luke 21:8; 2 John 9-10).

Yes, the true message of the kingdom of heaven is the very message Satan himself imitates, distorts and misquotes.

Facts from the word of God about the true kingdom message:

Jesus Christ was born of a woman to be a king (Luke 1:31-33). His kingdom will have no end. There will be no end to the increase of His government (Is. 9:6-7). Jesus Christ must reign on this earth until He has put all His enemies under His feet (1 Cor. 15:25). The last enemy He will abolish is death. Sin is death, and the soul that sins will die (not continue to live), declare the sacred Scriptures of God, which cannot be broken (Ezek. 18:20; Matt. 10:28).

Death is also personified as an angel. Revelation 9:1 says, "I saw a star from heaven that had fallen to earth." This star was Satan, the god with a thousand names. The angel's name is Abaddon, and in Greek his name is Apollyon or Apollo, the god of ancient Greece. Some of his other names include Hermes, Jupiter, Jove, Saturn, Poseidon, Atlas, Easter, Isis and Diana.

The Mystery of Jesus

When Jesus Christ asked His disciples who they thought He was, Simon Peter said, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said this knowledge was revealed to Peter by the Father who is in heaven (Matt. 16:16-17). What did the Apostle Peter know that was so shockingly true it had to be revealed by the Father in heaven?

Scripture after Scripture in the Old Testament affirms that the Lord is one God and not two. The pagans of long ago believed there were plural gods and plural saviors. What is a covenant? Sometimes it is referred to as a will or testament. The Bible has an Old Testament and a New Testament. The Old Testament contains the old covenant, and the New Testament contains the new covenant. The old Will of God was the Law of Moses. The new Will of God is the new covenant of Christ.


What is a covenant, will or testament? It is a legal, binding contract in which two or more parties engage. If we, the first party, agree to stop sinning through repentance, by glorifying the Father in heaven with good works (Matt. 5:16), then God, the second party, agrees to give us complete amnesty, not holding any past transgressions against us (Rom. 3:25; 1 John 1:9; 2:2; 4:10). We will receive a complete pardon. We will be reconciled to God and will come out from under the wrath of God and we, through God's grace, will inherit eternal life as a bonus (John 3:36). But this is all dependent on whether or not we live a new life for Christ, and begin to practice righteousness for God daily toward others, and overcome evil by doing good for God in Christ's name (Col. 3:17; Col. 1:10; Psalm 37:27).

The everlasting covenant was made with Abraham and it is in force for 1,000 generations. A thousand generations is 30,000

years, which means the everlasting covenant is still in force today (Gal. 3:17). Yes, the covenant God made with Abraham is still in force, and Moses' Law, which came 430 years later, does not in any way nullify the promise of the everlasting covenant (Gal. 3:18). A promise is not a law; it still remains a promise (Gal. 3:29). If you belong to Christ, you are Abraham's offspring, and you are heirs and recipients according to the promise of that covenant.

God says if we repent and live our lives to please Him daily, by keeping His Ways of practicing righteousness toward others daily and being just in all our dealings with others, He will bless us in this lifetime and give us the free gift of eternal life; and the blood of Jesus will cleanse us from all sin (Heb. 13:20-21; 1 John 1:7; 1 Peter 1:2). That is the everlasting covenant.
