The Lord is Coming as a Thief

Jesus Christ says in Revelation 16:15 that He is coming like a thief. He also says in that same verse, "Blessed is the one who stays awake and keeps his garments, lest he walk about naked and men see his shame." In this part of the verse, Jesus is saying blessed is that person who continues in righteousness. This also means being zealous for good works, overcoming evil by doing the deeds that Jesus came to show us, and enduring to the end keeping them (Rev. 2:26; 3:12, 15-19; 19:8). "Stays awake and keeps his garments" simply means to continue living the holy life without going back to the former life of practicing sin. "Naked" means he sins and people observe his sins.

Jesus continually warns those who would follow Him not to let down, but to continue being faithful in righteousness (Matt. 24:48-51). The parable of the ten virgins is partly about five virgins who let down-became lukewarm for good deeds. In other words, they began to lose interest in serving God by serving others and began to return to worldliness and sin (Matt. 25:1-13). As a result, they were not found fit by God to enter His kingdom and be invited to the wedding supper of the Lord, which is eternal life (Is. 25:6-7; Matt. 8:11; Luke 22:30). They left that Way of righteousness that the Lord came to show those who would follow Him (Matt. 21:32; 2 Peter 2:21). This is why the theme that runs through the entire New Testament is: Only those who endure to the end (living godly) will be saved (Matt. 10:22; 24:13; Mark 13:13; 2 Tim. 2:12;

Luke 21:19; Rev. 2:26). Remember, the end will come suddenly like a trap or thief (Luke 21:34-36).

The Lord is Coming as a Thief

Many of Jesus' parables speak of Jesus coming as a thief, when people would least expect Him. That is why you must live for God daily and be faithful to be saved (Luke 9:23). Jesus was asked, "Are just a few being saved?" And Jesus answered, "Yes," in the form of a parable in Luke 13:23-25.

Now we can begin to see why Jesus' true followers were persevering, steadily living a life of doing good for God daily. They were seeking from God glory and honor and immortality—eternal life (Rom. 2:7; Acts 9:36). How many are being taught to do the same today?

Jesus is coming first as a thief to take those who qualify and are found worthy to a place of safety.

Jesus is coming first as a thief to take those who qualify and are found worthy to a place of safety (Luke 21:36 KJV; Rev. 3:10). He is taking them from the presence of Satan, the soon-coming being who is called the beast or the son of destruction (Rev. 13:4; 2 Thess. 2:3). This beast will make war with the saints of God who are not found worthy to be taken to a place of safety, and many will be killed (Rev. 13:7). Those who are ready when the Lord comes as a thief will be taken as mentioned in Matthew 24:40-41. They will be translated, as Philip was, in physical form to a place of safety away from the presence of the soon-coming beast (Acts 8:39-40).

All of those who remain true to Jesus Christ until death will receive a crown of eternal life.

Those left behind, because they were not zealous for what is good, must be refined by God with imprisonment, captivity, torture, slavery and death (Rev. 2:10; 3:18-19; 13:10, 15; 14:13; 6:11; 1 Peter 3:13). All of those who remain true to

Jesus Christ until death will receive a crown of eternal life (Rev. 2:10; 20:4).

How blessed are those who are found worthy to be taken to a place of safety and protected from Satan.

How blessed are those who are found worthy to be taken to a place of safety and protected from Satan for three and one-half years, during the soon-coming reign of the beast on this earth (Rev. 12:14). "Time" is one year, "times" is two years, and "one-half time" is one-half of a year. This equals three and one-half years, the same length of time as Satan's rule on this earth in the form of a man (Rev. 13:5). Notice, Satan goes off to make war with the lukewarm saints, those who were left behind and who were not found worthy to go to a place of safety (Rev. 12:17; 13:7).

The Lord is coming soon as a thief. Be ready—stay ready—and continually pray that you will be found worthy to be protected from what is coming and have the Scriptures of the righteous fulfilled in your life (1 Thess. 5:9; 1 Peter 3:13; Is. 3:10; 2:10; 26:20; Ezek. 14:22-23; Psalm 27:5; Is. 42:10-13; Dan. 12:1; Mal. 3:16-17; Luke 21:36 KJV). Study—do not merely read but study—God's word by subject daily to be approved by Him; and pray always for other people God is calling, in the last days, to live a holy life before Him each day by being a servant to others (2 Tim. 2:15).□

Where Wisdom Ends and Faith Begins



Wisdom is the proper use of knowledge. When that knowledge is derived from philosophy or from the higher learning of man, it is termed human knowledge or philosophy. This type of wisdom is of the world and is foolishness according to the word of God (Eccl. 12:11-12, 1 Cor. 3:19).

Just as God gives His Holy Spirit to those who obey Him, He also gives His wisdom liberally to those who ask Him.

There is another wisdom, and it is from God. Just as God gives His Holy Spirit to those who obey Him, He also gives His wisdom liberally to those who ask Him (Acts 5:32; James 1:5). There is little godly wisdom in this world because God's words lie dormant in the Bible, waiting for people to obey them. God's wisdom is based on His laws. His laws are based on His Ways, and His Ways represent His Will. As His followers, we are to do His Will daily on this earth as it is done in heaven (Matt. 6:10).

As we grow daily in the Lord by imitating Him, our faith grows also.

King Solomon was God's example to the world of how much wisdom He is capable of bestowing on each of us if we will seek and obey Him by serving others for God's glory (1 Kings 3:9-12). When we are zealously obeying the Lord by keeping His deeds and <u>overcoming</u> our evil side, our faith in this spiritual Way of life increases. As

we grow daily in the Lord by imitating Him, our faith grows also (Eph. 5:1). Unless we become daily doers of His words, it is impossible for our faith to grow. James 2:22 says our faith is made complete by our works.

God causes the necessary growth and soon we become new creatures.

A transformation begins from the inside as we continue to live to please the Lord each day on the outside. Our love for God increases, as does our faith. As we continue to serve Him by serving others, we learn to <u>love one another</u> from the heart (1 Thess. 4:9; 3:12). God causes the necessary growth and soon we become new creatures (1 Cor. 3:7; Gal. 6:15).

There will be situations when we can do nothing and we must rely solely on the Lord to come to our rescue.

When we have done everything we can do in any given situation and the trial or test continues, then our faith in God takes over. As doers of God's word we can have full assurance that there is an answer or solution forthcoming from God (James 1:22). This full assurance comes when we live to do what is right in God's sight on a daily basis (1 John 3:22). There will be situations when we can do nothing and we must rely solely on the Lord to come to our rescue. Our daily righteous Way of life guarantees the Lord's response to our needs in these times of distress.

Where Wisdom Ends and Faith Begins

It is only when we do all we can according to the wisdom God gives us, and then rely on the Lord, that all will go well.

Blind faith, on the other hand, is when we force a test on God by allowing something wrong to continue without doing anything about it. It is only when we do all we can according to the wisdom God gives us, and then rely on the Lord, that all will go well. Remember though, we must do our part by using God's wisdom, instead of our own (Prov. 3:5). If we let our children do something dangerous and claim that God will protect them, we are forcing a test on God. We cannot allow our children to be in situations that could harm them mentally, physically or morally, and then expect God to protect them in that situation. This is forcing a test on God. It is not using godly wisdom, but rather the blind wisdom of this world.

But there are some who continue to live by their own thoughts, apart from what God's law book teaches.

God's wisdom warns those who desire to love and obey Him not to keep bad company. Evil people corrupt good morals (1 Cor. 15:33). Violence breeds violence. But there are some who continue to live by their own thoughts, apart from what God's law book teaches. They are not living by God's Ways, but continuing to live by their own ways and thoughts which are not good. Yet, they expect that if they have faith in God, the Lord will protect them in every situation. Not so! They are out of God's Will so their prayers are not according to God's Will.

Faith without the knowledge of God's word is dead, so continue to study to show yourself approved to God.

Faith without works is dead (James 2:26). Faith without daily obedience to God is dead. Faith without God's wisdom is dead. Faith without doing God's Will daily is dead. Faith without daily prayer is dead. Faith without the knowledge of God's word is dead, so continue to study to show yourself approved to God (2 Tim. 2:15).

Remember the big three. Put God first, then others, then yourself:

- 1. Study God's word daily (Acts 17:11).
- 2. Apply it by serving others for God (Matt. 25:40).
- 3. Pray for others first each day, and then for your own needs (1 Peter 3:12).

Study, apply and pray. This will assure the growth, the wisdom and the full assurance that the Lord will answer your prayers.

Clean out the old leaven—all your ways that are not presently pleasing to God—and become a new lump, a brand new creation (1 Cor. 5:7; Gal. 6:15). When you pray, make sure that you have done your part in the best way possible. Then you will have the full assurance that your prayers will be respected by the Lord. This is where wisdom ends and faith begins. □



What Holds You Back?



Resist Satan, and he will flee from you. Resist his fiery missiles. How does Satan operate in our lives in order to hold us captive to do his will (2 Tim. 2:26)? He can be given permission from God to remove understanding and the desire for understanding from our hearts (Matt. 13:19).

Few understand that Satan is deeply engaged in devouring disciples of Jesus Christ in order to make tares—people who say they are Christians but are not doing what Jesus Christ said to do (Matt. 13:37-50). You can identify them by their worthlessness for good deeds, even though they profess to know God (Titus 1:16).

Satan has all kinds of ministers who appear righteous on the outside (2 Cor. 11:13-15). John the Baptist knew who they were and called them a brood of vipers, a bunch of snakes. Jesus

called them serpents, as John did, because they were of the devil. He said, "How are you going to escape the sentence of hell?" (Matt. 23:33; Rev. 12:9; John 8:44).

They professed to know God but were not overcoming their lawless natures by doing good.

These ministers were in religion as a business. They were not interested in entering the kingdom of God by doing good works and glorifying God. They were telling the people that good works were not necessary for salvation. "You just give us your money, and we'll do the good works," they said (Matt. 23:13). Outwardly they appeared righteous to men but inwardly they were lawless hypocrites, worthless for any good deeds (Matt. 23:25; Titus 1:16). They professed to know God but were not overcoming their lawless natures by doing good (Rom. 12:21). They were not being careful to engage in good deeds done in Jesus Christ's name for God's glory (Titus 3:8; Col. 3:17; Matt. 5:16). They were not overcoming by keeping Christ's works (Rev. 2:26). Many, Christ said, would do greater works than He did (John 14:12).

Satan himself doesn't understand that he is being used by God to separate the precious from the worthless.

Satan is an enemy of all good works done for God, and yet he himself doesn't understand that he is being used by God to separate the precious from the worthless, the sheep from the goats, the wheat from the tares, the good fruit from the bad fruit, and the light from the darkness. Those who are found worthy, who have good deeds, will be resurrected to eternal life and will receive another reward from Christ (Luke 20:35; John 5:29; Matt. 16:27; Rev. 22:12). They will receive a reward based on good works. What is holding you back from doing good works for God?

Where is the True Church?

...Over time people have mistakenly associated church with a building.

In the New Testament, the word commonly translated church is "ecclesia," which means called out ones (Webster's New International Dictionary of the English Language, 1910). It in no way means a building, temple or synagogue. However, over time people have mistakenly associated church with a building.

Temple worship, or building-type worship, has serious drawbacks for the people of God. It all too often takes on a meaningless form of religion and becomes only a social club. The church, as the world knows it, has become a way of life in itself, often becoming exclusive, with the attitude of: "We are right and everyone else is wrong." This is very effective as a lock-in technique, but it makes people very cliquey, inward, selfish, and narrow minded or closed minded. This technique is used by many in the world.

Christ says His true followers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth.


Jesus said to the Samaritan woman, "The time is coming, and already is, when you will no longer worship God in a temple or in a mountain" (John 4:21). God was not pleased with that form of worship. Christ says His true followers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth (John 4:23). Jesus spoke of the true worshipers, which means there must also be false worshipers—tares, goats, dogs, etc.

True disciples of Jesus Christ know what worshiping in spirit and truth means. They know the Father wants to be glorified, so they glorify Him all day, every day, with good works (Matt. 5:16). They constantly do Jesus Christ's works—the works He said we would do to a greater amount than He, for He had to go to the Father (Rev. 2:26; John 14:12).

The true church consists of individuals who are living holy lives daily to please and glorify God (1 Peter 1:15-16). The true church is people who are called out to live righteously. It is not a building!
