Although one might be inclined to think that things in this world are out of control, this is expressly not so; especially when you understand what God is doing down here. God has put man on this earth to learn lessons. One of the greatest lessons man is learning is that his ways are not working.

Notice in Job 12:16-25 some of the things God does to evil men, of which they are unaware. We live in a world where people are deceived on every issue. No one seems to have the answers to today's problems. But the one who misleads and the misled belong to God. He is behind this deception because man will not seek Him and live for Him (Jer. 20:7). It says in Job he exposes counselors (lawyers) and makes fools out of judges (Job 12:17). It also says he makes nations great and He destroys them. He removes intelligence and understanding from the leaders of the people of earth making them move blindly and wander (Job 12:23-24).

In Revelation 16:21, God mentions hailstones as large as 100 pounds apiece. These He will rain upon the earth in the days directly ahead of us. Approximately 4,000 years ago, the Lord told Job about this hail which He has reserved for a particular day (Job 38:22-23). Enoch, in the seventh generation from Adam, also saw the storehouses of hail.

It is God who makes peace or creates evil (Is. 45:7). His hands bless and His hands curse. He is the one who repays both evil and good. He is the one who talks to Satan and gives him permission to test the righteous and destroy those who are evil (Job 1:8-12; 2:3-6). Yes, God is in control.

Spiritual Power

When God gives His Spirit to those who obey Him, that Spirit has power. It has a lot of power when it is accompanied by a righteous life. In James 5:16, God's word says a righteous man's prayers have a lot of power. Jesus said all things are possible to those who believe (Mark 9:23).

What is this power? God's people are given authority over all the powers of the enemy. Evil spirits must be subject to God's people (Luke 10:20). God's servants have the power to bind and loose on earth (Matt. 16:19). It is the power to forgive someone's sins or to retain those sins (John 20:23). That's power and authority, but that's not all.

The apostles of God were given authority to deliver an unrepentant and naughty person over to Satan for the destruction of that person's flesh, so his spirit might be saved in the day of judgment (1 Cor. 5:5). The Apostle Paul turned two other men—Hymenaeus and Alexander—over to Satan so they might be taught not to blaspheme (1 Tim. 1:20). The Apostle Peter had the authority to take the lives of Ananias and his wife Sapphira because they were lying to the Holy Spirit

(Acts 5:9-10). Paul fixed his gaze upon a man who was trying to interfere with the work God gave him to do and Paul, by the hand of the Lord, took the man's sight for a time (Acts 13:10-11). That's spiritual power!

Why was all this power necessary? It was necessary because precious lives were being lost because of evil men who were jealous of Paul. They spoke evil of him behind his back. They tried to steal those whom the Lord had put in Paul's charge (Jude 1:4; 2 Peter 2:1-3). They took Paul's mission for granted and became familiar.

False teachers who were not given authority by God began to undermine God's chosen servants and were bringing swift destruction on themselves. These false teachers would say, "Paul's full of wind. I am just as much of a man of God as he is. He is not so special." They might then attack his dress, his mannerisms and the like, just to undermine and cause dissension among the flock (2 Peter 2:1-3, 10-22).

These people caused divisions because they remained worldly minded. So God took His Spirit away from them (Jude 15-19). These people were bad people and bad company corrupts good morals (1 Cor. 15:33).

The apostles were given the authority to punish all those who were disobedient and who knew better (2 Cor. 10:6). They had authority to order a person to do what was right (Philemon 8-9).

The signs of the Lord's apostles were shown and known among the people (2 Cor. 12:12). They raised the dead, restored hearing to the deaf, healed the lame and sick, and performed miracles among the group.

The Apostle Paul sent instructions to the group by letter and said if anyone did not obey that letter, the people were not to have anything to do with that person. Yet, they were not to treat him as an enemy. They were to admonish that person (2 Thess. 3:14-15). The Apostle Paul told Timothy, in the last days, difficult times would come. People would be in very bad shape because the day would be so evil (2 Tim. 3:1-4).

Paul warned those God put in his charge to keep their eye on those who cause dissensions. He told people to stay away from them (Rom. 16:17-19).

The Holy Spirit stops you from going in the wrong direction and urges you to go the right way (Is. 30:21). It gives you prophecy and dreams with interpretations (Dan. 5:16-17; Gen. 40:8, 12; 41:15-16). The Holy Spirit can be grieved, and if you blaspheme against the Holy Spirit, you cannot be forgiven (Mark 3:29). The Spirit can whisper in your ear, make a donkey talk or shout from heaven (Num. 22:28; Matt. 10:27; Job 4:12).

The Holy Spirit is the power that created everything (Gen. 1:2). The Spirit makes all things possible to those who believe. You could literally move mountains with the power of the Holy Spirit (Matt. 17:20; 1 Cor. 13:2). That Spirit can move you physically through the air to a different location, make it possible to walk on water, stop the rain, kill trees, cast out demons, heal diseases and raise the dead (Matt. 14:26-27; Matt. 10:1; Mark 16:17; John 11:43; Acts 16:18; 8:39-40; Rev. 11:6; 1 Kings 17:1; Jonah 4:7).

People think of this Spirit as being the third person of the Trinity when, in fact, this Spirit is Jesus Christ (John 14:16-21, 28). Notice that the Holy Spirit is referred to as the Spirit of Jesus Christ in Acts 16:6-7 and gave Paul a vision in verse 9. Jesus said He is with you, referring to Himself, and will be in you (John 14:17-18; 15:26). Jesus promised to come to you. Jesus Christ and the Father will live in us (John 14:20; 17:26; Luke 17:21; John 14:23). We are taught by the Father and Jesus Christ (John 8:47; Luke 6:40).

A true disciple cannot stand against the devil without the power of the Holy Spirit. For that reason God gives His Spirit to those who repent and obey Him (Acts 2:38; 5:32).
