Moral standards have never been lower. Behavior that was considered immoral 40, or even 20 years ago, is now socially acceptable. Our politicians and leaders lie to us, without a second thought.

How can we have all these serious problems if our institutions of higher learning are so great? They have failed us and for good reason. Godlessness is taught in our colleges. Eastern religious customs, like yoga, meditation and mindfulness, are taught in our nursery schools, preschools, grade schools, high schools and colleges, among other things that do not agree with the word of God.

How Stubborn Are We?



In the parable of the sower, the only persons who made the grade, when they heard the true message of the kingdom, where those whose seed was sown on good ground (Matt. 13:23). The good ground represents those with an honest and good heart (Luke 8:15). There are very few people with honest and good hearts and that is why many are called and few chosen. It is also why very few find the narrow Way (Matt. 7:14).

You cannot know the message of God, unless you live the message by being a daily doer of good. You must put into practice the truth, in order to come to the understanding of the light (John 3:21). You must be willing to do God's Will, in order to know the teaching (John 7:17). You must live the message, in order to say you believe in Jesus Christ, then and only then will you never die (John 11:26). To believe in the Son is to obey the Son, and to obey the Son,

you must keep His sayings, do them and perform them (John 3:36; 8:51; 12:47-48; Luke 6:46).

The message of repentance is always the same. Overcome evil by doing good if you want to abide forever (Psalm 34:13-14; 37:27; Rom. 12:21; 1 Peter 3:10-11; Dan. 4:27; Is. 1:16-17; Zeph. 2:3). This is just what our evil nature does not want to hear. It wants to be told the message that says, do nothing and you will be saved (Titus 1:16).

When you hear this message, you are warned not to harden your heart by not starting to live it right away. The message of serving others, and doing good, becomes nothing more than a good intention to the many, but those few with honest and good hearts begin immediately so their hearts will not be hardened. A hardened criminal is one who is given every opportunity to change but doesn't. His desire is to remain who he is and not be told what to do. A hardened prostitute is one who sees no wrong in what she is doing, for she has justified all her evil ways, in her own mind. She possibly sees herself as doing a great service for mankind.

What happens to those God has called, who have less than an honest and good heart? Are they doomed to be destroyed in the lake of fire? In Revelation 3:15, the Lord is disturbed by those who do not continue to worship Him with their whole heart by being zealous, or hot, for good works (Titus 2:14). These people had been greatly blessed by God, but then became lukewarm for good works for God's glory (Matt. 5:16). This spiritual sickness happens to many (Rev. 2:5; 3:1-2). This is also what happened to the ancient Israelites when they had the same good news preached to them (Heb. 4:2).

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God wishes that none should perish, so he helps the disobedient to repent. God disciplines us for our own good (Heb. 12:10-11). In the very near future, He will bring many to repentance by bringing on the plagues of Revelation. He will make the sun seven times brighter, or hotter, to scorch men in order to force their evil natures to repent (Rev. 16:8-11). He will make hail, about 100 pounds in size, come down to get people's attention and help them repent. A worldwide earthquake will topple all the tall buildings in the cities of every nation (Rev. 16:18-19). Jerusalem will be split into three parts. However, people will continue to blaspheme God (Rev. 16:21). Remember, to blaspheme God, all you need to do is continue to live your old way of life and not change.

Spiritual Cowards



In Revelation 21:8, God's word says the cowardly will be put in the lake of fire, which is the second death. This is where the Lord not only destroys your body but also your mortal soul. This is proof that your soul is not immortal. Many today think you suffer in hell eternally and never die. Matthew 10:28 settles that. What, then, is a spiritual coward?

They could be those who live the message, but when persecution or temptation comes they fall away because they have no character or godly worth (Matt. 13:20-21).

Spiritual cowards are those who are stubborn and continue to hang on to their old ways, and refuse to turn from them. They knew the truth for a long time, accepted and lived the truth, then stopped, thus becoming salt that has lost its taste (Matt. 5:13). They are the mockers, fault-finders, and excuse makers, who will perish along with Satan and his demonic angels (Jude 16). They know to do good, yet do it not—the goats. They will not discipline themselves for the purpose of godliness, and as a result produce no fruit on their spiritual tree (1 Tim. 4:7; Matt. 7:17; 3:10; Col. 1:10). They will not stop doing things in their lives that are displeasing to the Lord. They will not stand up for Jesus and His truth.

Spiritual cowards are those who put doubt in the minds of others. The truth is something you can prove is correct by God's word. Doubt comes from man's wisdom. Man's wisdom is foolishness. It is made up of man-made traditions, ideas of men, interpretations of men, and false teachings by man that go against what God's word says. Doubt leaves room so no permanent change has to be made in one's life for the good (Mark 7:7; Titus 1:16).

A spiritual coward will not stand up for what is right and tell others, because it might destroy friendships or be bad for business. Now you know what a spiritual coward is.

In ancient Israel there were spiritual cowards too. The Lord told the Israelites not to practice the abominable customs of the pagans and thus defile themselves (Lev. 18:30; 20:23). God is

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adamant and means what He says when He shouts, "Learn not the way of the heathen" (Jer. 10:2—KJV). We are not to serve Jesus Christ, and honor Him, by inquiring how the heathens worship their gods and then worshiping Jesus Christ with those pagan teachings and customs. It's as clear as that (Deut. 12:30)!

Allowing yourself to adopt the way of the heathen, in even the smallest of ways, is allowing room for Satan to come in to your life. Dabbling in organized religion, mixing with other's who say they believe in God but don't hold to His true gospel, dilutes your commitment to God. You are allowing room for confusion, making excuse in your life for what others do that, 'isn't so bad.' We are called to come out of organized religion and all that man has done to corrupt and confuse We should not justify what we know is not pleasing to God. We are to live by the word of God only, and seek for ourselves what is true according to His word. We are to convict and convince ourselves of that truth and hold fast, not allowing any room for Satan to dilute our faith.

A heathen is also someone who is rude, ignorant and cruel. It is someone who is inhuman; destitute of kindness and tenderness, someone unfeeling. That is the way of the world. God's word says, "Come out of her My people that you may not participate in her sins, and that you may not receive of her plagues" (Rev. 18:4). We are to separate ourselves from the world, all of its attributes, false teachings and traditions of men. You are called out from the world when God reveals the truth of His word to you. You are to be different, and an example of godliness, not straying from the message and example that Christ came to show us.

Isn't it time we worshiped the Lord in Spirit and truth (John 4:23-24; Rom. 8:13), instead of continuing in religious lies and excuses? Isn't it

time for us to earnestly contend for the faith, which, was once and for all delivered to the saints of old (Jude 3)? This is that pure religion and is an attitude of being a full-time servant of others, as Jesus Christ our example was. It is learning to be righteous by practicing righteousness towards others daily. It is overcoming the evil pulls of our nature by continually doing good for others, and thus resisting Satan's pulls on our nature, as Jesus our example did. It is committing our minds, thoughts and actions to be pleasing to the Lord in all respects, not worshiping Him in vain (Mark 7:7; James 1:27).

This pure religion is continually walking in the Spirit (living to please God) so we don't carry out the desires of the flesh (Gal. 5:16). It is being spiritually aware at all times and spiritually discerning, as to what is good and wise, according to God's word, not making excuses for the flesh. It is fighting the good fight of faith by resisting evil daily for God. It is overcoming evil daily by doing good for the Lord, putting to death the deeds of the flesh by living for God (the Spirit). It is crucifying the flesh with its evil passions and desires (Gal. 5:24). It is overcoming our evil side by keeping Christ's deeds, words and sayings, and enduring to the end doing so. Thus, we are doing the Will of God only in our lives and we will live forever (1 John 2:17).
